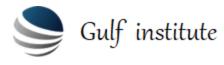
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Management Systems Auditor Training

INTRODUCTION

- This training course on Management Systems Auditor training course will give attendees a thorough in-depth knowledge of the International ISO management system standards on quality (ISO 9001:2015), environment (ISO 14001:2015) and occupational health and safety (ISO 45001:2018).

The emphasis on the results of auditing will be a focus for delegates to assist their own organisations in achieving improved performance in their businesses in the three given areas of quality, environment and health and safety, leading to improved profitability.
- This Management Systems Auditor training course is designed to involve all course delegates with a substantial number of team learning exercises.

OBJECTIVES


This training course is intended to give delegates the ability to:

- Health and Safety Performance

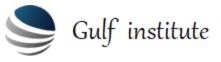
PERSONAL IMPACT
